

REFLECTIONS ON A SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

[The advent of the Prayer Shawl Ministry at Peace Lutheran of Alexandria ... how it began...]

In 2007 we gathered to discuss knitting, doing the Lord's work, and sharing it with others. Anne Whitten, a soul mate of mine, and I visited a women's group in Maryland that made shawls. In the following days we continued to ask God to guide us. It was Janet Bristow who reminded us that "Shawls ... made for centuries universal and embracing, symbolic of an inclusive, unconditionally loving God. They wrap, enfold, comfort, cover, give solace, mother, hug, shelter and beautify. Those who have received these shawls have been uplifted as if given wings to fly above their troubles...."

Feeling motivated, we brought the idea of forming a Prayer Shawl Ministry to a new small group at Peace. Women Renewing at Peace (WRAP) was a group of women supporting each other with bible study and some calm amidst the busyness of life. We pledged not to add more stress by adding more to do, but we were surprised by the support of this group. They even helped design a tag to go on our shawls (shown at the end of this article on the following page) and some even joined us for knitting.

We took our knitting ministry to Barcroft Starbucks with plans of meeting on Fridays, inviting others, praying for others and raising our awareness of a need to connect meaningfully with the community and our world.



We were totally amazed and renewed by wonderful notes of appreciation for the gifts of shawls. In the first year we distributed 60 shawls - all grounded in prayer. How awesome!

It was surprising how our little index card box began to fill with names and prayer requests.

Several random encounters were inspiring. A recent visitor to Starbucks on a chilly day noticed us knitting. She was dressed in a light blouse. We discovered she was visiting from California to attend her father's funeral. The conversation continued and soon she shared tears of loss and pain. We offered an aqua shawl to warm her and her heart. That day, as many others, God was with us and affirmed why we continue to share the love of Christ through a shawl.



Each year with the Spirit leading we made Haiti disaster washcloths, hats and scarves for homeless and marginalized children, Christmas tree gifts for a funeral home for remembering loved ones, and many more shawls for the birth of babies, confirmation, illness and death. The ladies have taught knitting and crocheting to others, including a grade school class. The number of Friday shawl makers varies from 4 to 18. Not all these ladies attend Peace because we have invited neighbors and friends to join. As of November 2013 the group has distributed 882 shawls. We wonder if we will run out of names; but no, the Lord has a plan for us and continues to bless and inspire us. Amen.

LEI CREATION A SYMBOL OF BOLD WOMEN’S DAY—2013 and 2014

As part of promoting the WELCA Bold Women’s Day celebration on February 23rd at Peace Lutheran in Alexandria, VA, the WRAP (Women Renewing at Peace) ladies practice finger knitting to create many Lei’s.



Mary Marquardt, who once lived in Hawaii, tells us that in Hawaii the Lei is worn as a "welcome symbol" to all who visit. The WRAP ladies attach the WELCA information tag on each Lei. Before each worship service they are distributed to those who gather to remind us we are all God’s instruments of peace and service.

It was such a success in 2013 we decided a repeat was in order. Thank you Mary Marquardt and Anne Whitten for teaching us to finger knit Lei’s in February. Bold Women’s Day was a time of recognition for the bold women at Peace. We joined in Fellowship Hall wearing our lei’s to welcome and

support each other in choosing to be Bold Women in Christ.



Peace ladies are invited to bring ideas on how to share our WRAP offerings near and far with others.

The March lesson will start with Psalm 30; which Martin Luther recognized as a rich resource for Christians. Then Judges 11: 1-40 which highlights a

daughter; a young woman who retreats to the mountains with her woman companions when her life is put in jeopardy by the oath of her father. She waves good-bye to a life that she had imagined for herself and her actions become a memorial to her when she returns to face death.

The ladies are using various hand gestures when we pray. The hands of this chapter are waving hands at eye level and just a small moving back and forth. When the hand is stationary, it is an acknowledgement of the one leaving. How do we at Peace wave goodbye to those you love? Think about how God's hands raised in acknowledgement of you. The ladies of WRAP are on a journey to discern how we pray individually and/or in groups. We welcome your input on this journey of discernment.

This group of spirit filled women meets monthly on the second Thursday.

Nominations are being requested for election of members to the SWO Executive Board. Positions open: President and two Board Members.


