The Rev. Amy Thompson Sevimli has been Assistant to the Bishop of the Metropolitan Washington, D.C. Synod of the ELCA since January 1, 2008. In 2003, Pr. Sevimli completed a Master of Divinity at Duke Divinity School in Durham, North Carolina. Included in her studies was a year at the University of Bonn in Germany. She received a Bachelor degree from Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, an ELCA institution of higher education. After graduating, Pr. Sevimli was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to study and teach in Germany. In 2008, she completed a Master of Sacred Theology (STM) in New Testament at the Lutheran School of Theology at Gettysburg.

She has published eight articles in Duke Divinity School's online magazine, Faith & Leadership, in 2010 and 2011 including: "Spiritually out of touch" and "Younger clergy and the new economic normal." In 2009 she was a Lewis Fellow with the Lewis Center for Church Leadership of Wesley Theological Seminary, and in 2014 she was a featured speaker at the Rethinking Faith Formation event at Luther Seminary. Presently she is a member of the ELCA Nominating Committee.

Pr. Sevimli is married and has two sons. She enjoys co-oping at her sons' preschool.
